What is the Program?

If you have never attended a chapel service at Goodwill it would be worth your time to stop by room 2013 on the second floor. Every Wednesday at 12:00pm, Brian Cinelli leads a non-denominational Christian worship service. The service begins with prayer requests and leads to singing. Brian provides an interactive object lesson or short message that he feels could benefit all attending in an informal and fun environment.

Who Does the Program Serve?

All staff and participants are welcome to attend Chapel services but most who attend are program participants. There are currently 26 people attending Chapel ranging in ages from 18 to 88!



A Personal Story:

Anthony started with Goodwill one year ago in the Transition Works Program. In June 2011 he transitioned to Disability Services as an adult. Anthony works in production, sorting and hanging hangers for the Dick's Corporation, and working on other production jobs. He is also a member of Consumer Council. Anthony's goal is to work competitively in a sports environment or with electronics. He is open to learning new tasks and job skills, is very friendly and outgoing. He enjoys attending the weekly Chapel services and says that he has fun and gets to spend time with friends.

How Does the Program Benefit Participants and the Community?

Brian's messages focus on acceptance, love, friendship and other life lessons. Brian describes the service as a place for folks to interact and feel a sense of belonging.

Special Program Accomplishments:

The program began with 8 people when Goodwill first moved to Lawrenceville and has increased to 26 attendees. The service allows attendees to interact, have a sense of belonging, express concerns and prayer requests.
